He moved west and held music normal schools and singing schools in Kansas and Iowa. He settled in Shenandoah, Iowa. There he taught music, travelling throughout the region, and operated a music publishing business. His most widely distributed publication was the class book the "Song Eureka." He died in in Shenandoah, Iowa. His compositions were tailored for music instruction.
