



Grace Wilbur Conant (1858–1948) was born in Boston, Massachusetts. Never married, she included her mother’s maiden name in her professional name. She was musical editor for the *Kindergarten Review* and authored or co-authored a number of books, including *Songs for Little People*, with Frances Weld Danielson (1905); *Worship and Song*, with Benjamin S. Winchester (1913); *Religious Dangers of Modern Tendencies in So-Called Religious Songs* (1917); and *Song and Play for Children*, with Frances Weld Danielson (1925). She composed many songs, hymns, and carols. She also wrote using the pseudonym A. B. Ponsonby. She died in Malden, Massachusetts.
