









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




































S. W. Straub (1879)

Solomon W. Straub (1842-1899) was born in De Kalb County, Indiana, and made music his life's work, residing much of his career in Woodlawn Park, a Chicago suburb. He was active in music education and conducted musical conventions throughout the central Mid-west. He authored many singing school books, Sunday School music books, choir and anthem books, and sheet music. He founded "Song Friend," a musical periodical, and owned and operated a music publishing company in Chicago. His sister Maria Straub was a poet and wrote many hymn texts. Both were active in the temperance movement and wrote works for the movement's use. He died in Chicago, Illinois.
